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**OPINION AND ORDER ACCEPTING OFFER OF SETTLEMENT
OF DAVID G. JOHNSON**

On May 2, 2003, the Commission filed a Notice of Intent to Suspend, Revoke, or Restrict Registration (“Notice”) against registrant David G. Johnson.¹ Johnson has submitted an Offer of Settlement (“Offer”). Upon consideration, the Commission has determined to accept the Offer.² Solely on the basis of the consent evidenced by the Offer, and without adjudication on the merits, the Commission finds that the facts set forth in the Notice constitute cause for a statutory

¹ The Notice alleges that Johnson’s registrations as an introducing broker doing business as Trademaster and as an associated person of Trademaster are subject to revocation, suspension or restriction under Sections 8a(2)(C) and (E) of the Commodity Exchange Act, as amended (“Act”), 7 U.S.C. §§ 12a(2)(C) and (E) (2001), because an order of permanent injunction has been entered against Johnson prohibiting him from engaging in fraud in violation of the Act and acting in any capacity for which registration with the Commission is required under the Act.

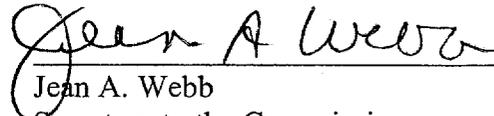
² In his Offer, without admitting or denying the allegations of the Notice, Johnson acknowledges service of the Notice; admits the jurisdiction of the Commission with respect to the matters set forth in the Notice; waives a hearing, all post-hearing procedures, judicial review by any court, and any objection to the staff’s participation in the Commission’s consideration of the Offer; and stipulates that the record basis on which this Opinion and Order (“Order”) is entered consists of the Notice and the findings to which Johnson consented in the Offer, which are incorporated in this Order. In addition, Johnson waives all claims which he may possess under the Equal Access to Justice Act, 5 U.S.C. § 504 (1994) and 28 U.S.C. § 2412 (1994), as amended by Pub. L. No. 104-121, §§ 231-32, 110 Stat. 862-63, and Part 148 of the Commission Regulations, 17 C.F.R. Part 148, relating to, or arising from, this action.

disqualification of Johnson under Sections 8a(2)(C) and (E) of the Act, 7 U.S.C. 12a(2)(C) and (E) (2001).³

Accordingly, the Commission HEREBY ORDERS that Johnson's registrations as an introducing broker and associated person are revoked.

A copy of this Order shall be served on Johnson at the address set forth in the Notice, on all contract markets, and on the National Futures Association.
