COMMENT

Re: CBOT Commodity limit change

Devastation! This one word expresses my thought of where the Chicago Board of Trade proposals of change will lead production agriculture. I am a lifetime farmer in Illinois presently producing corn & soybeans. For more than 40 years every bushel of production from our farm has been marketed through a hedging process using the Chicago Board of Trade futures positions. Under a structure now being proposed the risk of a locked out situation could create a position for us that may prevent a move in the futures through as many as 2 full sessions (or more). With all of our years production tied to the futures as well as some years in the past

2 years production fully hedges this close out time could bring total bankruptcy of our multi-generation farming operation.

As I see it the whole concept of the ^{original} development of the CBOT is at risk of being absolutely destroyed if a situation allowing a market shut down is granted.

Production, processing, terminal marketing on both buying and selling sides of the market depend on a dependable and stable futures market. With the possibility of market shutdowns chaos is inevitable.
