Order Dismissing Complaint

This proceeding was instituted by the issuance of a complaint as provided under Section 6(b) of the Commodity Exchange Act September 2, 1958. The complaint charged that the respondent became the buyer with respect to selling orders of his principals and the seller with respect to buying orders of his principals and executed orders of different principals against each other, all in violation of Sections 4b(B) and 4c(A) of the Commodity Exchange Act and section 1.38 of the regulations promulgated under the act.

On December 9, 1958, the complainant filed a motion to dismiss stating: "In the light of all the information now available, and after consideration of all facts and representations made by the respondent, the complainant is of the opinion that further proceedings are not warranted, and therefore moves that the complaint be dismissed."

Accordingly, the complaint is dismissed.
