Vacation of Stay Order

The order of March 2, 1951, which stayed the February 12, 1951 order of suspension of respondent's trading privileges pending the outcome of an appeal filed by respondent in the United States Court of Appeals for the Fifth Circuit, is vacated, and the order of February 12, 1951 is reinstated and made effective June 25, 1951.

ORDER VACATING STAY ORDER

An order was entered in this proceeding on February 12, 1951, suspending the respondent's trading privileges upon the contract markets for 60 days. On March 2, 1951, this order of suspension was stayed indefinitely pending the outcome of an appeal filed by the respondent in the United States Court of Appeals for the Fifth Circuit. On June 1, 1951, an order of dismissal was entered by the court pursuant to the motion of the respondent in this proceeding. Accordingly, the stay order of March 2, 1951, is vacated and the order of February 12, 1951, is reinstated. Effective June 25,

1951, all contract markets shall refuse to Claud Wilkes the privileges of trading thereon, either directly or indirectly, for a period of 60 days.
