ORDER OF DISMISSAL


On August 20, 1998, complainant William J. McGlinchey and respondents Allan Steven Adler, Commonwealth Financial Group, Inc. and William Gordon filed a Joint Stipulation of Dismissal With Prejudice ("Stipulation"), in accordance with 17 C.F.R. §12.21(a). The Stipulation stated that these parties had entered a settlement agreement providing for payments to complainant to be completed by October 6, 1998. Id. The Stipulation also provided that "[t]he parties agree that the Court shall retain jurisdiction over this matter until the final payment is received

by Complainant." Id.¹ Accordingly, the Court issued an Order staying this proceeding to ensure performance under the terms of the agreement. Order Staying Proceedings, dated August 20, 1998.

The Court's August 20, 1998 Order stated that if none of the parties requested further proceedings on or before October 13, 1998, the Court would enter the requested Order of Dismissal. Accordingly, since there is no such request pending, the Complaint is hereby **DISMISSED** with prejudice and the matter is terminated in its entirety. 17 C.F.R. §12.21(c).
