ORDER OF DISMISSAL

In February of this year, complainants Thanh Kim Huynh Sexton and John William Sexton, Sr. and respondent Mitchell Brad Goldberg filed a stipulation of dismissal in accordance with 17 C.F.R. §12.21(a). See Joint Stipulation of Dismissal With Prejudice, filed February 7, 2001. In the stipulation, they requested that prior to dismissing the complaint, the Court stay the case to the extent necessary to permit the full performance of their underlying settlement agreement (expected by July 31, 2001). Id. The Court granted the request. See Order, dated February 8, 2001. The Sextons now have informed the Court that full performance has occurred. See Memorandum from Bill Sexton to the Court, dated August 16, 2001. Accordingly, the complaint is hereby **DISMISSED** with prejudice and this proceeding is **TERMINATED** in its entirety. See 17 C.F.R. §12.21(c).
