**ORDER OF DISMISSAL OF RESPONDENT DOMANSKI; DEFAULT ORDER AND
REPARATION AWARD AS TO RESPONDENT CAMBRIDGE**

I.

Complainant and respondent Domanski have settled this matter and have filed a stipulation of dismissal that applies not only to complainant, but also to any claims that might also be raised by Medical Associates of the Bronx, Inc. Accordingly, the complaint is **DISMISSED** as to respondent Domanski.

II.

Respondent Cambridge has not filed an answer to the complaint. Accordingly, the allegations of the complaint are deemed true as to that respondent. Based on the complaint, it is determined that respondent Cambridge is **ORDERED** to pay reparations to complainant in the amount of \$2,887.80, plus costs in the amount of \$50.00. This amount equals complainant's total damages claimed minus the sum received by complainant in his settlement with Domanski.

Any motion filed to vacate this default must strictly comply with the requirements of CFTC Rule 12.23.
