Removal of Stay Order

On June 20, 1951 (10 Agric. Dec. 783 (10 A.D. 783)), a decision and order were entered in this disciplinary proceeding under the Commodity Exchange Act (7 U.S.C. Chapter 1) finding that the respondents the Great Western Food Distributors, Inc., Nathaniel E. Hess and Charles S. Borden violated the act and ordering the contract markets to deny them all trading privileges for the period of one year. The order of June 20, 1951, was stayed because of an appeal filed by the respondents in the United States Court of Appeals for the Seventh Circuit (10 Agric. Dec. 965 (10 A.D. 965)).

On January 14, 1953, the United States Court of Appeals for the Seventh Circuit upheld the decision and order of June 20, 1951, and on June 15, 1953, the United States Supreme Court denied application for a writ of certiorari.

Accordingly, the stay order of July 13, 1951, is vacated and the order of June 20, 1951, shall become effective on September 1, 1953.

A copy hereof shall be served upon the respondents and the contract markets by registered mail.
