Dear Mr. Kirkpatrick:

Chicago Mercantile Exchange Inc. ("CME" or "Exchange") hereby notifies the Commodity Futures Trading Commission ("CFTC" or "Commission") of plans to implement E-mini S&P 500 Equal Weight Index Futures Market Maker Program ("Program"). The Program will become effective on February 26, 2024.

Exhibit 1 sets forth the terms of this Program.

CME reviewed the designated contract market core principles ("Core Principles") as set forth in the Commodity Exchange Act ("CEA"). During the review, Exchange staff identified the following Core Principles as potentially being impacted: Monitoring of Trading, Execution of Transactions, Protection of Market Participants, Compliance with Rules, Availability of General Information, and Recordkeeping.

The Program will not impact the Exchange's ability to perform its trade practice and market surveillance obligations under the CEA. Exchange staff will monitor trading in the Program's products in order to prevent manipulative trading and market abuse. Additionally, the Exchange has implemented systems to track Program participants' volume to ensure proper distribution of earned incentives. The Program does not impact the Exchange's order execution. Participants in the Program will be selected by CME staff using criteria as set forth in Exhibit 1. Chapter 4 of the Exchange rules includes prohibitions against fraudulent, non-competitive, unfair or abusive practices. All participants must execute a contractual agreement with CME in which each participant will expressly agree to comply with, and be subject to, applicable regulations and Exchange rules. Additionally, the Program is subject to the Exchange's record retention policies, which comply with the CEA.

The Exchange certifies that the Program complies with the CEA and the regulations thereunder. There were no substantive opposing views to this Program.

EXHIBIT 1

E-mini S&P 500 Equal Weight Index Futures Market Maker Program

Program Purpose

The purpose of this Program is to incentivize participants to support the development of the products listed below. A more liquid contract benefits all participants in the marketplace.

Product Scope

E-mini S&P 500 Equal Weight Futures ("EWF") and BTIC on E-mini S&P 500 Equal Weight Futures ("EWFT") ("Products").

Eligible Participants

CME may designate up to fourteen (14) participants in the Program. Participants may be members or non-members. Potential participants are required to submit an application/bid sheet to the Exchange as part of a competitive application process which is used to determine eligibility. In determining whether or not a prospective participant is selected to participate in the Program, Exchange staff may take into account a variety of factors including the strength of the quoting obligations the prospective participant is willing to commit to provide, whether staff believes that the prospective participant can maintain such obligations, and historical volume trading similar products. The Exchange may, from time to time, add or subtract from the aforementioned requirements as it deems necessary.

Program Term

Start date is February 26, 2024. End date is August 31, 2024.

Hours

8:30AM CT - 3:00PM CT.

Obligations

In order to be eligible to receive the incentives, participants must quote two-sided markets in the Products at predetermined average bid/ask spreads and minimum quote sizes during a specified percentage of time-in-market.

Incentives

Upon meeting all obligations, as determined by the Exchange, participants will be eligible to receive predetermined incentives.

Monitoring and Termination of Status

The Exchange shall monitor trading activity and participants' performance and shall retain the right to revoke participant status if it concludes from review that a participant no longer meets the eligibility requirements or fails to meet the obligations of the Program.
