RE: FOIA Request for Confidential Treatment

Dear Sir or Madam:

The Minneapolis Grain Exchange, LLC ("MGEX") has submitted to the Commission a Rule Certification Submission pursuant to CFTC Regulation 40.6(a) for modifications to the Hard Red Spring Wheat Futures Incentive Program (hereinafter referred to as the "Confidential Submission" or "Program"). This Confidential Submission included as Exhibit A contains confidential commercial or financial information. MGEX respectfully requests that the Commission not release the Confidential Submission.

MGEX specifically requests confidential treatment of the Confidential Submission pursuant to Commission Regulations 145.9 and 145.5. Under Commission Regulation 145.9, a submitter making this request "shall specify the grounds on which confidential treatment is being requested." Confidential treatment is being sought on the basis that the Confidential Submission contains confidential commercial or financial information under Commission Regulation 145.9(d)(1)(ii). In addition, MGEX represents that the Confidential Submission is a nonpublic record pursuant to Commission Regulation 145.5.

In accordance with Commission Regulation 145.9(d)(5), MGEX asks the Commission to afford confidential treatment to the Confidential Submission in perpetuity.

Should the Commission receive a Freedom of Information Request for the Confidential Submission, MGEX acknowledges that it will be notified of the request and then instructed to provide a detailed written justification for confidential treatment, per Commission Regulation 145.9(e)(1).
