

The Commodity Futures Trading Commission ("CFTC" or "Commission") intends to award a contract to Page Vault Inc. for a software renewal of Page Vault Browser on a sole source basis. The anticipated contract will have a period of performance of one (1) year. CFTC currently uses Page Vault Browser as a web content collection tool for saving and/or printing web content, such as social media posts/profiles, entire websites, videos, images, or any other content accessible on a web browser that is needed for Enforcement matters. In carrying out the agency's mission, CFTC requires access to a trusted web collection tool that delivers accurate capture of data for case research and court evidence. This is essential in supporting authenticity of the data thus providing a properly documented chain of custody. Additionally, this tool provides different file type outputs that are most relevant to the collection such as PDF, e-Discovery load file, and video files. Page Vault is the only known tool that provides a securely hosted browser architecture that offers affidavits to back up the authentication of webpage evidence captured by it in accordance with Federal Rules of Evidence 901(b)(9). As a result, the Government intends to procure this requirement under USC 41 §3304 (a)(1) and FAR 13.106-1(b)(1)(i) which states "the circumstances of the contract action deem only one source reasonably available." The identified vendor is the sole provider of the required functionality and data required by CFTC. Therefore, this vendor is the only responsible source identified as reasonably available that will satisfy the agency requirements.

This notice does not constitute a solicitation for offers and, as such, no solicitation is available. However, the Government will consider written responses from all responsible sources received by 1:00pm ET, February 20, 2025. Written responses must include sufficient information to establish capability to fulfill the requirement. Oral communications are not acceptable in response to this notice. Any responses received will only be considered for the purposes of determining whether to conduct a competitive procurement in lieu of the sole source described in this notice, and such determination shall be made at the sole discretion of the CFTC.
