Pursuant to the authorization and direction contained in an Act entitled "An Act for the prevention and removal of obstructions and burdens upon interstate commerce in grain, by regulating transactions on grain future exchanges, and for other purposes," approved September 21, 1922 (42 Stat. 998-1003; U.S.C. title 7, secs. 1-17), known by the short title of "The Grain Futures Act," I, R. W. Dunlap, Acting Secretary of Agriculture, do hereby designate the Omaha Grain Exchange, of Omaha, Nebraska, as a "Contract Market" for wheat, corn, and oats under said Act, said Grain Exchange having applied for, and having otherwise complied with the conditions and requirements of said Act as a prerequisite to, such designation. Such designation is subject hereafter to suspension or revocation in accordance with the provisions of said Act.
