ISSUANCE OF COMPLAINT - CEA DOCKET NO. 81

(Administrative Hearing under the Commodity Exchange Act)

A complaint and notice of hearing has been signed by the Assistant Secretary of Agriculture, charging violation of the Commodity Exchange Act by:

The complaint charges that the respondent exceeded the limits on speculative positions in rye futures on the Chicago Board of Trade from December 31, 1957, through February 21, 1958, and concealed his violation of the position limit by failing to file reports with the Commodity Exchange Authority.

The issuance of a complaint under the Commodity Exchange Act does not constitute proof of violation of the law. Such violation is established only when the Judicial Officer of the Department has made a determination that the evidence substantiates allegations in the complaint. Complaints are filed in the Office of the Hearing Clerk of the Department of Agriculture and are a matter of public record. Pending disposition by the Judicial Officer, it is the policy of the Commodity Exchange Authority not to comment or elaborate on charges contained in complaints or to discuss evidence on which they are based.

A public hearing on the complaint is scheduled to be held before a referee at 10:00 a.m., local time, June 10, 1958, in Room 1200, Board of Trade Building, 141 West Jackson Boulevard, Chicago, Illinois.
