Bloomberg SEF LLC (the "<u>Applicant</u>"), as proposed operator of a swap execution facility, submitted to the Commission a Swap Execution Facility Application for Registration on Form SEF on June 4, 2013 (together with each exhibit thereto, the "<u>SEF Application</u>"), concurrently with a cover letter requesting temporary registration as a swap execution facility pursuant to Commission regulation 37.3(c).
